1: General description

CRC Electro Cool Pro consists of liquefied gases under pressure. The fluid evaporates very quickly and, in doing so, extracts heat due to evaporation, from the environment. As a result, the sprayed surface cools down considerably. CRC Electro Cool Pro evaporates completely and leaves no residue. Commonly used materials are not attacked. There is no explosion or flammability risk under practical application conditions.

2: Features

3: Applications

4: Directions

Trouble shooting:

- Switch on the equipment.
- Allow warming up until operating temperature is reached or fault occurs.
- When normal operating temperature is reached or the equipment malfunctions, suspected components are purposefully sprayed with CRC Electro Cool Pro.
- Observe changes in operation of the equipment.



Protection:

During soldering or the use of other heat sources in the area of electronic components that are heat sensitive, the sensitive component can be kept at low (acceptable) temperatures by spraying short shots of CRC Electro Cool Pro at regular intervals onto the component.
